

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1464

WHEREAS, on June 3, 1966, the Papago Tribal Council passed Resolution No. 1464 and cited "Section 2 (c) as Authority", and

WHEREAS, Section 2 (c) is not the proper authority, therefore, the council re-enacted the following resolution, and

WHEREAS, Carl Dyer, doing business as Indian Oasis Trading Post of Sells, Arizona has applied for a lease of 25 years of the premises now occupied by him, and

WHEREAS, the present 5 years lease of the property will expire on June 30, 1966, and

WHEREAS, the new lease is to be for a period of 25 years, commencing on July 1, 1966, and this application has been approved by the Papago Tribal Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Papago Council hereby authorizes and approves the granting of the said lease to the Indian Oasis with all of the terms of the new lease to be the same in the present lease of the premises with the exception of changes herein set forth.

The foregoing resolution was on September 2, 1966 duly enacted by a vote of 17 for and 0 against, by the Papago Council, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in it by Section 3 (d) of Article V of the Constitution of the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to the rescission by the Secretary of the Interior pursuant to Section 3 (a) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe.
