

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 1489

WHEREAS, many Papago people want to build better homes for themselves and their families, and

WHEREAS, financial institutions both public and private, which lend money for home building purposes under guarantee by the Federal Housing Administration, Farmers Home Administration, Veterans Administration and/or other government agencies require that the borrowing home builder has a legal assignment to the land to be used for the home site, and

WHEREAS, the term of assignment of such land for home building require a minimum term of 65 years for such use.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Tribal Council, as a matter of policy desires to implement the construction of adequate housing for all members of the Tribe, and to make available to all members of the Tribe the various Federal programs now in being to provide such housing, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman, on being furnished satisfactory evidence of District Council agreement to utilize district lands for home building purposes is authorized and directed to execute, on behalf of the Papago Tribe land assignments or permits in such form as may be required by the lending agencies, provided, however, that in no event shall such permit or assignment extend beyond a term of 70 years and provided further that title to such lands shall not be divested from the Papago Tribe of Arizona.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Tribal Council on September 2, 1966, with a vote of 17 for, 0 against and 0 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to the authority vested in the Council by Section 3 (d) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by the Secretary of the Interior pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe..
