

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL -

RES. NO. 1491.

WHEREAS, Maricopa County Highway Department has made application for a 40-foot road right-of-way along the east boundaries of the following tracts of land acquired for the New Sil Murk Village:

Tract No. 1 (South) - ENE1/4 Section 25, T.53.,
R. 5W., G&SEM, Arizona, containing 20 acres, and

Tract No. 2 (North) - EASE1/4 Section 25, T.53.,
R. 5W., G&SEM, Arizona, containing 20 acres, and

WHEREAS, The Papago Council agreed to grant the right-of-way to the Maricopa County Highway Department, who will in turn permit the Stout Water Company, Gila, Bend, Arizona to lay a pipeline within the said right-of-way so that water may be made available to the New Sil Murk Village site; and

WHEREAS, At the same time, the Arizona Public Service Company also requested a right-of-way to the houses within the new Sil Murk Village with the Electric and Gas lines, and

WHEREAS, The People of Gila Bend District Council approved to grant the right-of-way gratis as the Papago Indians will receive certain benefits from the construction of the road and water line and also grant the right-of-way to the Arizona Public Service Company, at a meeting held on September 20, 1966.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED by the Papago Council that the right-of-way be granted to Maricopa County Highway Department in line with the above; that the right-of-way be granted gratis as the Papago Indians will receive certain benefits from the construction of the road and the water line and also grant the right-of-way to Arizona Public Service Company.

The above Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on October 21, 1966, with a vote of 16 for, 0 against and 1 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Section 3(h) of Article V of the Constitution and By Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval of the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to rescission by a Secretary of the Interior, pursuant to Section 6 of Article V of the constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe.
