ARTICLE; That Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe grants the Papago Council the power to protect the physical safety and morale of the Tribe, to provide for public welfare, and to regulate domestic relations of members of the Tribe, and

ARTICLE; The Papago Council has the further power to provide for the maintenance of law and order and the administration of justice by establishing a Tribal Court, or courts, and a police force, and defining the powers and duties of such courts and police, and

ARTICLE; The Papago Council, in preparation for accepted plan for reorganization and development of the tribal government, can exercise the further power to appoint subordinate boards and officers and to prescribe their duties and powers,

ARTICLE; BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PAPAGO COUNCIL; That it hereby creates the Papago Law and Order Board consisting of eleven (11) members with one member being appointed by the people of each of the eleven Districts of the Papago Reservation;

ARTICLE; That they shall serve as the grace of the Apache and the District Councils, and

ARTICLE; That the Papago Law and Order Board shall meet at least once a month at a time and place to be prescribed by its members;

RESOLVED: That it is the popular feeling of the tribal members within the Jurisdiction of Chairman, Vice-Chairman, and a majority of the tribal members at the annual general meeting,

that the Papago: Board of Directors of the Papago Tribe shall make known their views and wishes to the Board of Directors of all of the Boards and Committees of the Papago Council, and, in accordance therewith, establish by the Budget Resolutions of The Papago Council, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the duties and responsibilities of the Papago Law and Order Board shall be:

1. The review and study of the overall law and order situation on the Papago Reservation, including action of the Papago Law and Order Board and all assemblies and resolutions of The Papago Council which pertain to the administration of law and order.
2. Recommendations to the Papago Tribal Council, or courts, Papago Police Department, Papago Advisory Council, The Papago Council, Commissioner of Indian Affairs and the Secretary of the Interior regarding the maintenance of law and order and the administration of justice.

This Seconding Resolution was duly enacted by The Papago Council on April 14, 1967, with a vote of 22 for, 0 against, with 0 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Sections "(e), (f), and 3(a) and (b) of the Constitution and By-Laws of The Papago Tribe
