## RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 19-68

WHEREAS, Mr. Clarence Black and Mr. Garth S. Black are desirous of a road permit to construct an accessway from the area of North Komelik Village south to the Gu Achi Peak area of the Santa Rosa Mountains; and

WHEREAS, This accessway is necessary for Messers. Black to conduct their necessary mining operations; and

WHEREAS, The Sif Oidak Council did on July 11, 1968 approve the granting of a road permit to construct an accessway from North Komelik Village south to the Gu Achi Peak area of the Santa Rosa Mountains; and

WHEREAS, It is in the best interests of The Papago Tribe to grant such a road permit;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PAPAGO COUNCIL; That Messers. Clarence and Garth Black are hereby granted a road permit to construct an accessway from North Komelik Village south to the Gu Achi Peak area of the Santa Rosa Mountains, Provided, that Mr. Clarence Black of 3100 Mowry Ave., Suite 410, Fremont, California will deposit \$100.00 to the credit of the Sif Oidak District Council at the Papago Agency, Sells, Arizona and \$100.00 to the credit of The Papago Tribe of Arizona at the Papago Tribal Office, Sells, Arizona.

The foregoing resolution was duly enacted by The Papago Council on July 15, 1968, with a vote of 20 for, 0 against, and 2 absent, at a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in The Papago Council by Article V, Section 2(c) of the Constitution and By-Laws of The Papago Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984). Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is not subject by review by the Secretary of the Interior pursuant to Section 2 of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of The Papago Tribe.
