

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 29-68

WHEREAS: The Papago Tribe has been offered three office buildings which are located within the Papago Agency compound and are now owned by the Bureau of Indian Affairs, and have been declared surplus to the needs of the Papago Agency by the Bureau of Indian Affairs; and

WHEREAS: the Bureau of Indian Affairs is now willing to transfer title of these buildings to The Papago Tribe for their use as offices and for development of Tribal programs; and

WHEREAS: the Bureau of Indian Affairs is willing to make complete transfer of title to these buildings, whose designations are No. 1, No. 2 and No. 75, including furniture, equipment and fixtures; and

WHEREAS, The Papago Council has considered this offer by Superintendent Joseph M. Lucero, and has determined that these buildings can be put to good use for the Tribal Programs and is therefore appreciative of said offer.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PAPAGO COUNCIL: that it hereby requests the Superintendent of the Papago Agency that title to buildings No. 1, No. 2 and No. 75, including furniture, equipment and fixtures, be transferred to The Papago Tribe; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: that The Papago Tribe accepts these buildings subject to, and in accordance with the reversionary clause and all other provisions of Public Law 991, an Act of Congress approved August 6, 1956; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: that The Papago Tribe shall make necessary arrangements for utilities and other services to these buildings.

The foregoing resolution was duly enacted by The Papago Council on November 15, 1968, with a vote of 19 for; 0 against, 0 not voting, during a meeting at which a quorum was present, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 2 (a) of the Constitution and By-Laws of The Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (48 Stat. 984) pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18,

1934. Said resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
