RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

WHEREAS, Mabel P. Antone, Papago Tribal Judge, has served the Papago Tribe well during the past two years, and

WHEREAS, Mabel P. Antone is interested in serving as Tribal Judge for another two years, and

WHEREAS, it is to the best interests of the Papago Tribe that Mabel P. Antone serve as the Papago Tribal Judge.

Now, therefore, let it be resolved that the Papago Tribal Council hereby recommends to the Commissioner of Indian Affairs that he or his duly authorized representative appoint Mabel P. Antone for two years as Papago Tribal Judge.

The foregoing resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Tribal Council at a meeting at which a quorum was present, on April 5, 1968, with a vote of 12 for, 9 against, and 1 not voting, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Article V, Section 3 (b) and (f) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (Stat. 984) pursuant. to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said resolu-_tion_is_effective_as_of_the_date_of_its_approval_by_the -Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
