## RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 9-68

WHEREAS, El Paso Natural Gas Company has filed an application dated February 29, 1968 for a Right of Way 40 feet in width for a term of twenty years for the construction of a natural gas pipe line across tribal lands of the San Xavier Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the pipe line is to serve gas to the Duval Mining Area and will involve construction from El Paso's main transmission lines in a north and south direction across 643.39 rods of tribal lands in Sections 26 and 35, Township 15 South, Range 12 East of the San Xavier Reservation, and

WHEREAS, the Applicant has consented to the assessment of damages based on \$2.00 per lineal rod for the length of the proposed pipe line and in addition to pay actual damages to growing crops caused by the construction of the pipe line, and

WHEREAS, El Paso Natural Gas Company has agreed to abide by the regulations in 25 C.F.R., Part 161,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Tribal Council hereby consents to El Paso Natural Gas Company constructing a natural gas pipe line across the above described tribal lands subject to the conditions as heretofore set forth in this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Tribal Council at a meeting at which a quorum was present, on April 5, 1968, with a vote of 22 for, o against, and 0 not voting, pursuant to authority vested in the Council by Article V, Section 3 (d) and (h) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (Stat. 984) pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said resolution
