

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 12-76

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has a Law and Order Code which establishes  
2 a Tribal Court, Jail staff, and Police Department and de-  
3 fines the duties of the staff in those departments; and  
4 WHEREAS, the Tribe feels that it is capable of operating these  
5 departments in a capable manner with only technical advise  
6 and training from the Agency Special Officer and the two  
7 Supervisory Policemen now stationed at Sells, Arizona; and  
8 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe feels that these departments should be  
9 under the supervision and control of the Tribe; and  
10 WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs has funds to operate these  
11 departments.

12 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that the Tribal  
13 Chairman be authorized to enter into a contract and/or  
14 grant proposal with the Bureau of Indian Affairs in which  
15 the Tribe will employ and supervise the employees in the  
16 Judicial, Detention and Enforcement Departments and the  
17 Bureau of Indian Affairs will provide the funds for opera-  
18 ting these departments.

19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said Contract shall not be effective  
20 unless an adequate added amount of money is granted to the  
21 Tribe as and for Contract Support Funds to cover direct  
22 and indirect costs of implementing said Contract, and of  
23 Tribal assumption of operations of said Departments.

24 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on  
25 the 5th day of March, 1976, at a meeting at which a quorum was  
26 present with a vote of 834.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 3  
27 absent; pursuant to the authority vested in the Council by Section  
28 2 (a) Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe  
29 as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on DEcember 12, 1936, and  
30 approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (48  
31 Stat. 984) pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934.  
32 Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the  
Superintendent of the Papago AGENCY and is not subject to review by  
the Secretary of Interior.
