

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL
(CETA OFFICE)

RECEIVED APR 23 1976

RES. NO. 16-76

1 WHEREAS, the Papago CETA Program is now occupying office space in BIA quarters
2 building No. 66 and is paying to BIA a rent of \$71.50 per month for that
3 space; and

4 WHEREAS, it is possible via this resolution for that building to be transferred
5 by BIA to the Tribe for continued use as the CETA office; and

6 WHEREAS, said building is in structurally sound condition, and

7 WHEREAS, the CETA Program desires to make certain modifications to said building
8 in order to provide additional office, interview, and consultation space
9 and such improvements will increase the value of said building, a bene-
10 fit which on transfer could accrue to the Tribe rather than the Bureau;
11 and

12 WHEREAS, CETA funds are available for the maintenance of said building and, hence,
13 there is no reason which contradicts the value of said transfer,

14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PAPAGO COUNCIL that:

15 a) It does request the Acting Superintendent, Sells Agency, to transfer
16 title of said building, No. 66 to the Papago Tribe;

17 b) It does authorize the Chairman to accept said building in the name
18 of the Papago Tribe and to assign said building for continued use by
19 the CETA Program free of any rent or other charge, but conditional
20 upon the Program's maintenance of said building with Program funds;

21 c) It does authorize the expenditure of not more than \$2,500 of CETA
22 Program funds for such renovations as may be judged necessary by the
23 CETA Director to maximize the usefulness of said building.

24 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 2nd day of
25 April, 1976, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 834.0 for;
26 0 against; 0 not voting; and 2 absent, pursuant to authority vested in the Papago
27 Council by Section 2 (d) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the
28 Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and
approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (48 Stat. 984) pur-
suant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective
as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is
not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.

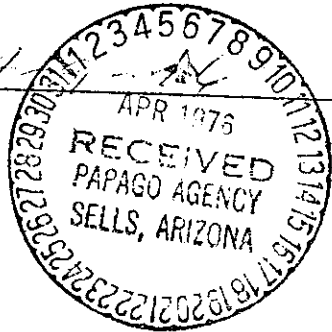
