

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 18-76


1 WHEREAS, the State of Arizona has requested the use of an area 100 x 100 feet on
 2 top of Baboquivari Peak for the period of one year, with option for an
 3 additional one year period, in order to install, maintain and operate a
 4 radio repeater needed in policing drug and narcotics trafficking and
 5 smuggling along and across the international boundary with Mexico; and
 6 WHEREAS, drug and narcotics trafficking and smuggling have become a serious
 7 threat to the peace and social order on the Papago Reservation and it
 8 would be in the best interest of the Papago Tribe if they were controlled.
 9 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Papago Council that it does hereby approve
 10 a Lease of a radio repeater site on top of Baboquivari Peak to the State
 11 of Arizona and that Cecil Williams and Mary Jane Jones, Chairman and
 12 Secretary respectively of the Papago Council are hereby authorized and
 13 directed to execute said Lease for and on behalf of the Papago Tribe.


14 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 2nd day
 15 of April, 1976, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 834.0
 16 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 2 absent; pursuant to authority vested in the
 17 Papago Council by Section 2 (h) and 3 (b) (e) and (h) of Article V of the Consti-
 18 tution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified by the Tribe on
 December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6,
 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said
 Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of
 the Papago Agency, and is subject to review by the Secretary of Interior.

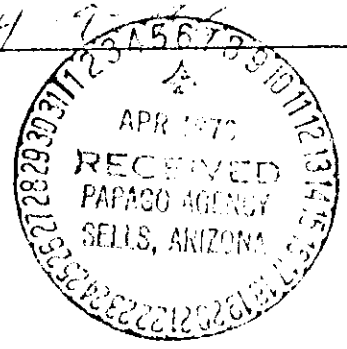
