convey to the United States of America, in trust and for the benefit of the Papago Indian Tribe, certain lands located in Pinal County, Arizona, known as Papago Florence Village and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the northeast corner of the Eyer property, which is designated as Parcel No. 1 within Section 3, Township 5 South, Range 9 East, Gila and Salt River Meridian, Arizona. The Metes-and-Bounds description is as follows:

Line AP 1 - AP 2 S. 81° 55' W., 2.443 chs., line AP 2 - AP 3 S. 20° 35' E., 0.800 chs., line AP 3 - AP 4 S. 66° 31' E., 1.434 chs., Line AP 4 AP 5 S. 0° 55" E., 3.030 chs., line AP 5 - AP 6 S. 89° 05' W., 2.879 chs., line AP 6 - AP 7 N. 0° 55' W., 4.212 chs., line AP 7 - AP 8 S. 74° 10' W., 3.036 chs. (end of course, intersect the north and south centre line of the southeast quarter of Section 3), line AP 8 - AP 9 (on the north and south centre line of the southeast quarter) S. 0° 39' E., 32.10 chs. (end of course, the east 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 3 and 19), line AP 9 - AP 10 (between sections 3 and 10) N. 88° 55' E., 6.69 chs., line AP 10 - AP 1 N, 0° 42' W., 33.33 chs. (end of course, the place of beginning); and

WHEREAS, said lands were acquired by the United States of America under provisions of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984); and

WHEREAS, it is the wish of the Papago Tribe that said lands be added to and made a part of the Papago Indian Reservation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that the Secretary of Interior is hereby requested for an order or other appropriate action setting aside said lands as tribal lands for the benefit of the Papago Indians of Arizona and making said lands a part of the Papago Indian Reservation.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 7th day of May, 1976, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 834.0 for; O against; O not voting; and 4 absent; pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council by Article I and Section 3 (h) of Article V of the Constitution and Bylaws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, and pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency, and is subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
