RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 24-76

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Council created a Construction Department which now has 3 1/2
2 years of experience and is capable of performing quality work in all
3 phases of construction and which now has an annual Papago payroll in ex-
4 cess of \$250,000; and

5 WHEREAS, the Tribe has hired a general manager qualified and experienced in all
6 types of construction work and holder of an Arizona Contractor's License;
7 and

8 WHEREAS, the Papago Construction Department is thus fully qualified both manage-
9 rially and in the trade skills required to undertake any type of project
10 expected to occur on the reservation; and

11 WHEREAS, 85% of the 37 Department employees are Papago and each \$100,000 of addi-
12 tional contracts will provide 4 to 6 additional Papago jobs; and

13 WHEREAS, this Papago employment level is far higher than is achieved by outside
14 contractors.

15 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PAPAGO COUNCIL THAT:

- 16 1. It does recognize and fully support the work of the Construction
17 Department.
- 18 2. It does require all Tribal Departments and requests all other
19 agencies, including BIA and IHS, to:
 - 20 a. Inform and involve the Construction Department from
21 the beginning in all plans for construction projects
on the reservation;
 - 22 b. Provide Papago Construction with the first opportu-
23 nity to bid on all construction projects;
 - 24 c. Wherever legally possible, utilize those construction
25 and financing mechanisms which are most likely to
result in award of construction projects and contracts
to the Construction Department.

26 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 7th day of
27 May, 1976 at a meeting at which a quorum was present, with a vote of 399.0 for;
28 193.5 against; 241.5 not voting; and 4 absent, pursuant to authority
29 vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (f) of Article V of the Constitution
30 and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified by the Tribe on December 12,
1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (49 Stat.
984) pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effec-
31 tive as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and
32 is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
