

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 26-76

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Reservation range lands have been subjected to six years of
 2 continuous drought and subsequent loss of vital livestock forage; and
 3 WHEREAS, the Papago livestock industry has been critically impaired with great
 4 economic loss to over 800 families residing on the Reservation; and
 5 WHEREAS, the cost of purchasing supplemental forage from outside sources is econom-
 6 ically impossible because of high feed prices; and
 7 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe is trying to alleviate this extremely serious situation
 8 that affects basic tribal income and does further serious damage to
 9 Reservation range lands.

10 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Tribe declares a state of extreme
 11 emergency and requests Bureau of Indian Affairs financial and technical
 12 assistance to allow the development of irrigated pastures at Vaiva Vo in
 13 order to permit drought stricken cattle a chance to survive the ravishes
 14 of the drought through a planned deferment and rotation program on the
 15 Papago Reservation.

16 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 7th day of
 17 May, 1976, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 834.0 for;
 18 0 against; 0 not voting; and 4 absent; pursuant to the authority vested in the
 19 Council by Section 2 (a) and (d) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of
 20 the Papago Tribe as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936,
 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to
 Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effec-
 tive as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and
 is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
