

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 29-76

1 WHEREAS, Papago Construction recommends the purchase of a cement batch plant, in-  
2 cluding trucks and related equipment, for a sum not to exceed \$125,000.00  
3 which would substantially reduce the cost of cement for construction on  
4 the Reservation, and result to substantial savings to Papago Construction.

5 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that Papago Construction is  
6 authorized to purchase a cement batch plant, including trucks and related  
7 equipment, for a sum not to exceed \$125,000.00, provided that the Papago  
8 Tribe can obtain a firm loan commitment, guaranteed by the F.H.A., for  
9 the necessary purchase price.

10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman and other appropriate officers of the  
11 Papago Council are hereby authorized to execute any loan, purchase or  
12 related documents necessary or incidental to the purchase of such cement  
13 batch plant.

14 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 4th day of  
15 June, 1976, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 723.5 for;  
16 0 against; 110.5 not voting; and 1 absent; pursuant to the authority vested in the  
17 Council by Section 2 (a) and (c) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of  
18 the Papago Tribe as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936,  
and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to  
Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effec-  
tive as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency  
and is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
