


RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL
(Papago Mining Institute)

RES. NO. 31-76

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has undertaken the development of some of
2 the natural resources on the Papago Reservation in order to
3 provide job opportunities to members of the Papago Tribe; and
4 WHEREAS, there are employment opportunities now available to trained
5 Papagos in the mines on or near the Reservation; and
6 WHEREAS, there is substantial unemployment among working age Papagos
7 on the Reservation; and
8 WHEREAS, the Papago Council did authorize the establishment of the
9 Papago Mining Institute by Resolution No. 38-73 to provide
10 training in mining to members of the Papago Tribe; and
11 WHEREAS, training ceased at the Institute in December 1976 due to a
12 lack of funding;
13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Council reaffirms its
14 support of the Papago Mining Institute program and authorizes
15 the Tribal administration to seek funding from any Federal,
16 State or private sources available in order to continue
17 operation of the Papago Mining Institute.

18 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on
19 the 11th day of June, 1976, at a meeting at which a quorum was pres-
20 ent with a vote of 834.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 2 absent;
21 pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a),
22 (f) and (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the
23 Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936,
and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, and
pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984).
Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the
Superintendent of the Papago Agency, and is not subject to review by
the Secretary of the Interior.

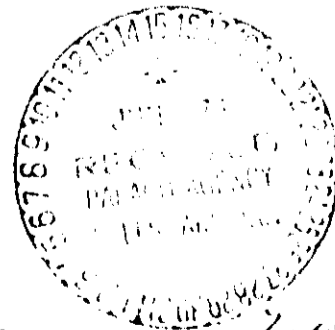


