WHEREAS, the inter Tribal Council of Arizona (ITCA) has in the past year demonstrated that it can be an effective organization 2 for participating Indian Tribes to air common concerns and 3 to determine appropriate action in situations of common 4 concern; and 5 WHEREAS, the ITCA has, on behalf of the participating Indian Tribes, 6 7 been active in the following areas: Liaison for Tribes on federal and state legislative 8 and policy issues. 9 Liaison to national Indian organizations on policy 10 developments. 11 Increasing the visibility and influence of ITCA with private business, governmental agencies and the poli-12 tical sectors. 13 Effectively demonstrating ITCA capability in program development by maintaining a variety of projects and activities of importance to member Tribes; 14 and WHEREAS, the original grant to ITCA from the Four Corners Regional 15 16 Commission will be insufficient to fund ITCA's programs at 17 the required program level; and WHEREAS, the Executive Committee of ITCA has requested membership 18 19 contributions from participating members; and 20 NHEREAS, the Executive Committee of ITCA has requested membership con 21 tributions from participating members; and 22 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe is a participating member of the ITCA and 23 it would be to the benefit of the Papago Tribe to support 24 the ITCA by a membership contribution. 25 NOW, THEREFORE, BE.IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that the Treas-26 urer of the Papago Council is hereby authorized and directed 27 to pay to the Inter Tribal Council of Arizona the sum of 28 \$500.00 for its general purposes. 29 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 11th day of June, 1976, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 834.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 2 absent; pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a), (d) and (f) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the 30 Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936,

and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, and
