

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 32-76

1 WHEREAS, the Inter Tribal Council of Arizona (ITCA) has in the past  
2 year demonstrated that it can be an effective organization  
3 for participating Indian Tribes to air common concerns and  
4 to determine appropriate action in situations of common  
5 concern; and

6 WHEREAS, the ITCA has, on behalf of the participating Indian Tribes,  
7 been active in the following areas:

8 Liaison for Tribes on federal and state legislative  
9 and policy issues.

10 Liaison to national Indian organizations on policy  
11 developments.

12 Increasing the visibility and influence of ITCA with  
13 private business, governmental agencies and the poli-  
14 tical sectors.

15 Effectively demonstrating ITCA capability in program  
16 development by maintaining a variety of projects and  
17 activities of importance to member Tribes; and

18 WHEREAS, the original grant to ITCA from the Four Corners Regional  
19 Commission will be insufficient to fund ITCA's programs at  
20 the required program level; and

21 WHEREAS, the Executive Committee of ITCA has requested membership  
22 contributions from participating members; and

23 WHEREAS, the Executive Committee of ITCA has requested membership con-  
24 tributions from participating members; and

25 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe is a participating member of the ITCA and  
26 it would be to the benefit of the Papago Tribe to support  
27 the ITCA by a membership contribution.

28 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that the Treas-  
29 urer of the Papago Council is hereby authorized and directed  
30 to pay to the Inter Tribal Council of Arizona the sum of  
31 \$500.00 for its general purposes.

32 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on  
the 11th day of June, 1976, at a meeting at which a quorum was pres-  
ent with a vote of 834.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 2 absent;  
pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a),  
(d) and (f) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the  
Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936,  
and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, and

1 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984).  
2 Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the  
3 Superintendent of the Papago Agency, and is not subject to review by  
4 the Secretary of the Interior.
