

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 34-76

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has assumed under a temporary federal pur-
2 chase order the operation of foster care facilities for
3 minor children on the reservation; and

4 WHEREAS, said child care operations have been temporarily assigned
5 to the Executive Health Staff, which assumed the responsi-
6 bility for organizing and setting up the center on extreme-
7 ly short and difficult conditions, and has done an excellent
8 job; and

9 WHEREAS, a request was submitted to BIA Area Office for a Buy Indian
10 Contract to continue operations after June 30, 1976, and
11 said request was rejected with the reason that all contracts
12 must now be negotiated under PL 93-638; and

13 WHEREAS, it is essential that BIA funds be available to continue
14 operations after June 30, 1976, and there is very limited
15 time to negotiate a contract.


16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PAPAGO COUNCIL that it does:

- 17 a. Request that the Executive Health Staff assume
18 operation of the foster child home as a perma-
19 nent responsibility;
- 20 b. Request the Chairman to meet with the Executive
21 Health Staff to determine what resources and
22 support are needed for this operation, and to
23 exercise every effort to meet those needs;
- 24 c. Request the BIA Area Director to extend the
25 existing purchase order for a minimum one month
26 period (July 31, 1976) in order to permit contract
27 negotiations to be conducted in a rational manner;
- 28 d. Authorize the Executive Health Staff to prepare and
29 the Chairman to submit a contract proposed under
30 either Buy Indian or PL 93-638 regulations, which-
31 ever is judged to be in the best interests of the
32 Papago Tribe;
- e. Request the BIA Area Office to accede to the
decision of the Papago Tribe as to whether Buy
Indian or PL 93-638 procedures are best for pro-
cessing of this particular contract.

30 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on
31 the 11th day of June, 1976 by a vote of 834.0 for; 0 against; 0 not
32 voting; and 2 absent; during a meeting at which a quorum was present,
pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council by Article V,
Section 2 (a), (e), (f) and (h) and Section 3 (a) of the Constitution
and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified by the Tribe on

1 December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on
2 January 6, 1937 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of
3 the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency
4 and is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
