

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 35-76

1 WHEREAS, Public Law 93-638 authorizes the awarding of grants to
2 tribes for the purpose of planning and improving tribal ad-
3 ministrative capabilities in order to begin contracting for
4 and operating various BIA programs; and

5 WHEREAS, there are certain BIA programs for which the Papago Tribe is
6 interested in contracting and therefore needs to prepare to
7 administer; and

8 WHEREAS, grant funds for FY-76 are to be allocated within this month
9 and the Tribe is eligible to apply immediately for this
10 assistance and a resolution is required in support of such
11 application.

12 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE PAPAGO COUNCIL DOES:


- 13 a. Authorize the Chairman of the Papago Council to
14 prepare and submit applications for grant assist-
15 ance under FY-76 funds from P.L. 93-638;
16 Said proposal to be prepared in accord with the
17 the administrative needs of both the general
18 Tribal administration and of the various depart-
19 ments which may be involved in contracting;
- 20 b. Authorize the Chairman to concurrently notify
21 the BIA Area Office of the Tribe's desire to
22 investigate and initiate contract procedures for
23 certain BIA programs.

24 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on
25 the 11th day of June 1976, at a meeting at which a quorum was pres-
26 ent with a vote of 834.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 2 absent;
27 pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (d)
28 of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of
29 Arizona ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and
approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, (48
Stat. 984) pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said
Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Super-
intendent of the Papago Agency and is not subject to review by the
Secretary of the Interior.
