


RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL
(Johnson O'Malley Funding)

RES. NO. 36-76

1 WHEREAS, the amount of Johnson-O'Malley funding per non-BIA Indian
2 student is considerably less than the approximately \$2,000
3 yearly base funding for Indian students attending BIA
4 schools; and
5 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe's Indian Education Committee is very con-
6 cerned and disappointed that JOM funding base is so low; and
7 WHEREAS, it is essential and in the best interest of the Papago Tribe
8 that funding per non-BIA Indian student be increased to
9 equal the BIA base per Indian student either by increasing
10 JOM funding per student or by any other supplemental means.
11 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Tribal Council gives
12 its full support to the Papago Education Committee in regard
13 to this urgent matter and requests the BIA to use every
14 means possible to increase yearly funding per non-BIA Indian
15 student so that such funding equals the BIA yearly base per
16 Indian student either by increasing JOM funding per student
17 or by any other supplemental means.

18 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on
19 the 4th day of June, 1976, at a meeting at which a quorum was present
20 with a vote of 834.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 1 absent; pur-
21 suant to authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2, (a),
22 (d) and (k), Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago
23 Tribe of Arizona ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and
24 approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (48 Stat
25 984) pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Reso-
26 lution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superinten-
27 dent of the Papago Agency, and is not subject to review by the
28 Secretary of the Interior.




