

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 38-76

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Council did on June 4, 1976, by Resolution No. 29-76 approve  
2 the purchase of a cement batch plant, including trucks and related equip-  
3 ment, for a sum not to exceed \$125,000.00, provided the Papago Tribe  
4 could obtain a firm loan commitment for such purchase price, guaranteed  
5 by the F.H.A.; and

6 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has obtained a firm loan commitment for such purchase  
7 price without the F.H.A. guaranty, and it is to the best interest of the  
8 Papago Tribe that the purchase of the cement batch plant be completed  
9 forthwith and without F.H.A. guaranty.

10 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that Papago Construction is  
11 authorized to purchase a cement batch plant, including trucks and related  
12 equipment, for a sum not to exceed \$125,000.00, and that the Chairman and  
13 other appropriate officers of the Papago Council are hereby authorized to  
14 negotiate a purchase loan from the First National Bank of Arizona, or any  
15 other accredited banking or lending institution, and to execute on behalf  
16 of the Papago Tribe any loan or purchase agreement, and any note, security  
17 agreement or related documents necessary or incidental to the purchase of  
18 of such cement batch plant.

19 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 2nd day of  
20 July, 1976, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 579.0 for;  
21 0 against; 255.0 not voting; and 0 absent; pursuant to the authority vested in the  
22 Council by Section 2 (a) (f) and (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws  
23 of the Papago Tribe as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936,  
and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to  
Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effec-  
tive as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and  
is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
