

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL.

RES. NO. 40-76

1 WHEREAS, the Chukut Kuk District did by Council Resolution reserve and set over to
2 the Papago Tribe, and to the supervision and control of the Papago Coun-
3 cil, those arable lands situated in the southwestern portion of the
4 Chukut Kuk District known as Papago Farms consisting of approximately
5 3600 acres for the purpose of further subjugating and irrigating said
6 lands for farming and grazing; and

7 WHEREAS, the Papago Council believes it to be in the best interest of the Papago
8 Tribe that it immediately take over the operation and control of said
9 lands; and

10 WHEREAS, a state of extreme emergency exists brought on by six years of continuous
11 drought which requires the immediate use and development of all possible
12 farm and livestock forage resources on the Papago Reservation.

13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby accept
14 supervision and control of the approximately 3600 acres of arable lands
15 in the Chukut Kuk District known as Papago Farms.

16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Papago Council hereby requests Bureau of Indian
17 Affairs financial and technical assistance to further the subjugation and
18 irrigation of said land for the purpose of farming and grazing and in
19 order to permit drought stricken cattle on the Papago Reservation a chance
20 to survive the ravishes of the drought through a planned deferment and
21 rotation program on the Papago Reservation.

22 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 12th day of
23 August, 1976, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 834.0 for;
24 0 against; 0 not voting; and 1 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the
25 Council by Section 2 (a) and (d) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of
26 the Papago Tribe of Arizona, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and
approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section
16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of
the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is not
subject of review by the Secretary of the Interior.
