

PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL RESOLUTION

P.L. 93-638 Contract-Law & Order

RES. NO. 42-76

1 WHEREAS, P.L. 93-638 does authorize the B.I.A. to contract with eligible tribes
2 for delivery of Bureau funded services; and

3 WHEREAS, the Sells Agency has FY-76 money available for:

- 4 a. Supplemental Law Enforcement Services;
5 b. Support of Tribal Judicial System; and

6 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe needs these services and is capable of providing them;

7 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY The Papago Council that:


8 A. It does authorize the Chairman to submit a contract proposal to
9 the Bureau of Indian Affairs for:

- 10 1. \$36,400 for support of expenses of the Tribal
11 Judicial System;
12 2. A sum of money still to be determined by the
13 Bureau for performance of Supplemental Law
14 Enforcement Services;

15 B. Does specify that said contracts shall run from 1 January, 1976 to
16 31 December, 1976.

17 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 12th day
18 of August, 1976 at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 834
19 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 1 absent; pursuant to authority vested
20 in the Papago Council by Section 2(a) of Article V of the Constitution and By-
21 laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936,
22 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, and (48 Stat.
23 984) pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is
24 effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago
25 Agency, and is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
