WHEREAS, the Papago Council did on June 4, 1976, by Resolution No. 29-76, and by Resolution Amended as of July 2, 1976, Resolution No. 38-76, approve the purchase of a cement batch plant, including trucks and related equipment, for a sum not to exceed \$125,000, provided the Papago Tribe could obtain a firm commitment for such purchase price; and

WHEREAS, the First National Bank approved of said loan, providing three provisions are agreed to as follows:

- That said loan would be a commercial loan with a floating interest rate of 2 ½% over Prime Rate;
- That said loan would be for a five year period with a two year stop;
- 3. That the Tribe secure said loan by an Assignment of a percentage of net smelter receipts from ores produced from Hecla Mining Company; and

WHEREAS, the cement batch plant is a Tribal operation and therefore it is in the best interest of the Tribe to agree to the loan conditions of the First National Bank.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that Papago Construction is authorized to purchase a cement batch plant, including trucks and related equipment, for a sum not to exceed \$125,000.00, and that the Chairman and other appropriate officers of the Papago Council are hereby authorized to negotiate a purchase loan from the First National Bank of Arizona, or any other accredited bank or lending institution, with the following loan conditions:

- 1. That said loan would be a commercial loan with a floating interest rate of 2 ½ over Prime Rate;
- That said loan would be for a five year period with a two year stop;
- 3. That the Tribe secure said loan by an Assignment of a percentage of net smelter receipts from ores produced from Heela Mining Company; and

to execute on behalf of the Papago Tribe any loan or purchase agreement

and any note, security agreement, assignment or related documents necessary or incidental to the purchase of such coment batch plant.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 12th day of August, 1976, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 801 for; 33 against; 0 not voting; and 1 absent; pursuant to the authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (2) (f) and (h) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
