

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 45-76

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Reservation has been without the services of a permanent
 2 Superintendent since the resignation of Mr. Joseph Lucero; and
 3 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribal Council has over a period of several months studied the
 4 qualifications of all applicants for said position; and
 5 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribal Council did select three of the applicants to appear
 6 before the Council for an oral examination of each of the applicant's
 7 qualifications; and
 8 WHEREAS, each councilman or councilwoman consulted with his or her District Coun-
 9 cil and members of the Papago Tribe residing therein on the selection of
 10 applicants for Superintendent; and
 11 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribal Council, after due consideration and study, has reached
 12 a decision regarding the preference of the various applicants for the
 13 position of Superintendent of the Papago Reservation.

14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Tribal Council has determined that
 15 Mr. Richard Christman is the most suitable and qualified applicant for
 16 the needs of the Papago Reservation and the Papago People and therefore
 17 the Papago Tribal Council, on behalf of the Papago Tribe of Arizona, does
 18 hereby recommend to the Commissioner of the Bureau of Indian Affairs that
 19 Mr. Richard Christman be appointed to serve as the Superintendent of the
 20 Papago Reservation.

21 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 12th day of
 22 August, 1976, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 664.0 for;
 23 0 against; 170.0 not voting; and 1 absent; pursuant to authority vested in the
 24 Papago Council by Section 3 (f) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of
 25 The Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved
 by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (48 Stat. 984) pursuant to
 Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the
 date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency, and is subject to
 review by the Secretary of the Interior.
