

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 48-76

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Constitution provides that each District shall, through its  
2 District Council, govern itself and manage its local affairs, including  
3 the preparation and adoption of District budgets; and

4 WHEREAS, the Papago Constitution impresses upon the Papago Council the obligation  
5 of controlling all Tribal funds not under the control of Congress, and  
6 of recommending appropriation of Tribal and other funds within the con-  
7 trol of Congress or of the Secretary of the Interior; and

8 WHEREAS, the Baboquivari District Council has prepared and  
9 adopted a District budget for the forthcoming fiscal year; and

10 WHEREAS, the Papago Council has reviewed said budget and finds it in every respect  
11 just and proper.

12 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that the budget of the  
13 Baboquivari District, as prepared and adopted by its Dis-  
14 trict Council and as attached hereto, is hereby approved, ratified and  
15 confirmed.

16 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 6th day  
17 of August, 1976, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a  
18 vote of 834.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 2 absent; pur-  
19 suant to authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 3 (a) of Article V of  
20 the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona, ratified by the Tribe  
on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6,  
1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said  
Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of  
the Papago Agency; and is subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
