

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 52-76

1 WHEREAS, the Tribal Work Experience Program (TWE) has been successfully adminis-  
2 tered during the past year; and

3 WHEREAS, the Papago Council did on August 6, 1976 review and approve the proposed  
4 budget for the TWE Program; and

5 WHEREAS, it is to the mutual benefit of the Papago people and the Bureau of Indian  
6 Affairs to continue the existing contract for Tribal Work Experience  
7 services.

8 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Council does request a contract  
9 with the Bureau of Indian Affairs to conduct the Tribal Work Experience  
10 Service Program in accordance with the staffing and funding request en-  
11 closed with the Tribe's P.L. 638 contract application.

12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Cecil Williams, Chairman of the Papago Council, or in  
13 his absence the Vice Chairman, is hereby authorized to negotiate and  
14 execute the contract or amendments thereto for the duration of the contract.

15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said contract shall begin on October 1, 1976 and end  
16 on September 30, 1977.

17 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 10th day of  
18 September, 1976, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 834.0  
19 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 1 absent; pursuant to the  
20 authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (a) of Article V of the Constitution  
21 and By-laws of the Papago Tribe as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on  
December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937,  
pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution  
is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago  
Agency and is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
