

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 55-76

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Council has been, and will continue to be faced
2 with the situation where it has before it more than two
3 nominations for election to a particular office or offices
4 and needs a voting procedure to resolve the election prob-
5 lems inherent in such situations; and

6 WHEREAS, the Papago Council is in its procedures governed by Article
7 II of the By-laws of the Papago Tribe which specifies that
8 a "majority of the votes cast shall govern the actions of
9 the Papago Council".

10 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that in the
11 event the Papago Council has before it more than two nomi-
12 nations for election to a particular office or offices, the
13 Council shall vote separately for each office, each member
14 of the Council casting his/her vote for the nominee of his/
15 her choice for such office; upon completion of such vote
16 the Secretary shall count and call the vote; if one of the
17 nominees has received a majority of the votes cast he/she
18 shall be elected to such office; if none of the nominees
19 have received a majority of the votes cast, the Chairman
20 shall submit the names of the two nominees having received
21 the highest number of votes for such office to the Council
22 for further election and the nominee receiving a majority
23 of the votes cast shall be elected to such office.

24 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on
25 the 8th day of October, 1976; at a meeting at which a quorum was
26 present with a vote of 769.0 for; 0 against; 65.0 not voting; and
27 2 absent; pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council by
28 Section 2 (f) of Article V of the Constitution and by Article II of
29 the By-laws of the Papago Tribe, as amended; ratified by the Tribe
30 on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior
31 on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18,
32 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date
of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is
not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
