RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 55-76

WHEREAS, the Papago Council has been, and will continue to be faced with the situation where it has before it more than two nominations for election to a particular office or offices and needs a voting procedure to resolve the election problems inherent in such situations; and

WHEREAS, the Papago Council is in its procedures governed by Article

II of the By-laws of the Papago Tribe which specifies that
a "majority of the votes cast shall govern the actions of
the Papago Council".

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that in the

event the Papago Council has before it more than two nominations for election to a particular office or offices, the
Council shall vote separately for each office, each member
of the Council casting his/her vote for the nominee of his/
her choice for such office; upon completion of such vote
the Secretary shall count and call the vote; if one of the
nominees has received a majority of the votes cast he/she
shall be elected to such office; if none of the nominees
have received a majority of the votes cast, the Chairman
shall submit the names of the two nominees having received
the highest number of votes for such office to the Council
for further election and the nominee receiving a majority
of the votes cast shall be elected to such office.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 8th day of October, 1976, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 769.0 for; 0 against; 65.0 not voting; and 2 absent; pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (f) of Article V of the Constitution and by Article II of the By-laws of the Papago Tribe, as amended; ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
