

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 58-76

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Council has reviewed the recommended budgets sub-
2 mitted by the various department heads; and

3 WHEREAS, the Papago Council desires to continue the expansion of
4 economic and growth opportunities on the Papago Reservation;
5 and

6 WHEREAS, the future potential growth in educational, health, welfare
7 opportunities, mining, utilities, industrial and social
8 economic development requires increased expenditures and
9 operating capital on contracts for this fiscal year; and

10 WHEREAS, the Tribe anticipates receiving revenues sufficient to cover
11 the Tribal budget for this fiscal year, but Tribal revenues
12 may be insufficient for operating capital to cover the Tri-
13 bal programs and contracts; and

14 WHEREAS, in order to guarantee that Tribal employees and just credi-
15 tors will be paid, the Tribal Council passed a resolution
16 authorizing the Chairman to establish a method of borrowing
17 funds with repayments to be made from a percentage of the
18 net smelter receipts due the Tribe from the Hecla ore body.

19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Council hereby adopts
20 the budget of the Papago Tribe as established, a copy of
21 which is attached hereto and made a part hereof, at a total
22 figure of ONE MILLION SEVEN HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE THOUSAND FOUR
23 HUNDRED NINETY-TWO DOLLARS (\$1,751,492.00), being the opera-
24 ting budget for the fiscal year July 1, 1976 to June 30,
25 1977.


26 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on
27 the 8th day of October, 1976, at a meeting at which a quorum was
28 present with a vote of 834.0 for; 0 against; 0 not vot-
29 ing; and 2 absent; pursuant to authority vested in the Papago
30 Council by Section 3 (a) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws
31 of the Papago Tribe of Arizona, ratified by the Tribe on December 12,
1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937,
pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution
is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of
the Papago Agency and is subject to review by the Secretary of the
Interior.
