

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 59-76

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Council did on September 25, 1975, pass Ordinance
2 No. 55, superseding and voiding Ordinances No. 39 (passed
3 on September 2, 1960), and No. 42 (passed on August 4, 1961)
4 and ordaining that all income derived from the use, permit,
5 or lease of Tribal lands for mining purposes, including gas
6 and oil, after September 25, 1975, be allocated as follows:

7 1) One-half thereof shall be deposited to the
8 general account of the Papago Tribe to be appro-
9 priated under Tribal budget or by Resolution
10 of the Papago Tribal Council, along with other
11 Tribal income, for the use and benefit of the
12 Papago Tribe; and

13 2) One-half thereof shall be deposited in an
14 interest bearing account for the benefit of the
15 eleven Districts of the Papago Reservation until
16 the Papago Tribal Council shall, by superseding
17 Ordinance, have determined how, when and in
18 which proportions the funds in said account shall
19 be paid to or for the benefit of the various Dis-
20 tricts of the Papago Reservation; and

21 WHEREAS, the original copy of aforementioned Ordinance No. 55 was
22 lost in transit and before it could be reviewed by the
23 Secretary of Interior; and

24 WHEREAS, it was and is the intention of the Papago Council that said
25 Ordinance No. 55 take effect at the date of its enactment.

26 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does
27 hereby enact and republish Ordinance No. 55, a copy of which
28 is attached hereto and is by this reference incorporated
29 herein, nunc pro tunc and effective as of the date of its
30 enactment on September 25, 1975.

31 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on
32 October 8, 1976, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a
vote of 834.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 2 absent; pursuant
to authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 3 (1) of Article
V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona,
ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the
Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section
16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is
effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of
the Papago Agency and is subject to review by the Secretary of the
Interior.

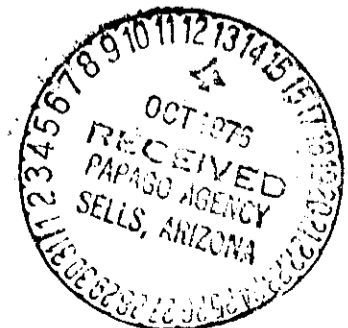
