

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 60-76

1 WHEREAS, the raising of cattle and horses is an important part of the Papago econ-
2 omy, creating new jobs, new income and adding to the food supply; and

3 WHEREAS, the Economic Development Administration of the U.S. Department of Commerce
4 has responded to a request for assistance and offered a cash grant for
5 the construction of a Papago Livestock Complex to stimulate the growth
6 and the economic well-being of the livestock industry; and

7 WHEREAS, an E.D.A. grant of \$861,000 for this project was offered in 1973 for the
8 project on which construction was started in 1975; and

9 WHEREAS, all construction has now been completed and inspected and approved by the
10 project architect, Joe B. Wong of Scottsdale, except for the "armor coat"
11 paving which has failed and must be redone; and

12 WHEREAS, completion dates for the correction of the paving problem cannot be set
13 because the prime contractor has defaulted on his contract and gone out
14 of business; and

15 WHEREAS, it is important for the Tribe to begin using the facility as soon as
16 possible to gain experience in the management and operation of the
17 Complex.

18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Council by this Resolution accepts
19 the project as complete with the exception of the armor coat paving which
20 may be accepted at a later date when the necessary work has been completed.

21 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 8th day of
22 October, 1976, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 801.0
23 for; 33.0 against; 0 not voting; and 2 absent; pursuant to the
24 authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (a) of Article V of the Constitution
25 and By-laws of the Papago Tribe as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on
December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937,
pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution
is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago
Agency and is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.


