## RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 62-76

WHEREAS, by letter dated June 29, 1976, Morris Thompson, Commissioner of Indian Affairs, advised that on July 18, 1977, the statute of limitations codified as 28 U.S.C., Sections 2415 and 2416, will prevent the United States from litigating certain claims on behalf of Indians and Indian Tribes which arose before July 18, 1966, and requested all Area Directors and Agency Superintendents to identify and document such claims before such deadline approaches; and

WHEREAS, the Papago Council believes that the Papago Tribe has claims against the United States Government which come within the purview of 28 U.S.C., Sections 2415 and 2416, resulting from the illegal entry, construction and maintainance of a flood control dam and reservoir designed to protect the Casa Grarde-Stanfield area off of the Papago Reservation, which Dam is located on the Santa Rosa Wash in the Sif Oidak District of the Papago Reservation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby request the Bureau of Indian Affairs to take notice of such claims and requests the Bureau of Indian Affairs to identify and document such claims, and to prepare and process litigation investigations and reports and requests for litigation or for funds necessary for the United States on behalf of the Papago Tribe, or for the Papago Tribe on its own behalf to initiate appropriate litigation of such claims prior to July 18, 1977.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 8th day of October, 1976, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 834.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 2 absent; pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a), (b) and (d) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
