22	The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 8th day of October, 1976, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 834.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voing; and 2 absent; pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council by Article V, Section 2 (a), (d), (h) and (k) of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Intrior on January 6, 1937, (48 Stat. 984) pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934.
