

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 66-76

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Education Committee, through the authority of
2 the Papago Tribal Council, is the primary contractor for
3 Johnson O'Malley funding for Indian Oasis Public School
4 #40; and

5 WHEREAS, Indian Oasis Public School District #40's insufficient tax
6 base, together with existing Arizona State laws make this
7 School District the worst underfinanced Public School Dis-
8 trict in the State of Arizona; and

9 WHEREAS, Indian Oasis Public School District #40 operates at a level
10 well below Arizona State standards; and

11 WHEREAS, JOM supplemental basic aid funding is the only available
12 source of immediate financial assistance to keep this School
13 District operational; and

14 WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the Papago Tribe that emer-
15 gency funding be requested immediately for the educational
16 needs of the Papago Children attending Indian Oasis Public
17 School District #40.

18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that the Papago
19 Education Committee urgently request immediate supplemental
20 emergency funding for the educational needs of Papago chil-
21 dren attending Indian Oasis Public School District #40.

22 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on
23 the 8th day of October, 1976, at a meeting at which a quorum was
24 present with a vote of 834.0 for; 0 against; 0 not vot-
25 ing; and 2 absent; pursuant to authority vested in the Papago
26 Council by Article V, Section 2 (a), (d), (h) and (k) of the Consti-
27 tution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona, ratified by the
28 Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Inte-
29 rior on January 6, 1937, (48 Stat. 984) pursuant to Section 16 of
30 the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the
31 date of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and
32 is not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
