

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 67-76

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has a need for immediately available expert
2 advice and assistance in the field of agricultural, range,
3 livestock and home economic operations; and
4 WHEREAS, the University of Arizona is no longer able to provide the
5 necessary assistance within the imposed budget limitations;
6 and
7 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe is now able to itself administer and pro-
8 vide such extension services; and
9 WHEREAS, the Land Operations Branch of the Bureau of Indian Affairs
10 has funds appropriated to provide such services during
11 FY-77.
12 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does
13 hereby request a contract with the Bureau of Indian Affairs
14 to provide general agricultural extension services in
15 accordance with the staffing and funding request enclosed
16 with the Tribe's P.L. 93-638 contract application.
17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Mr. Cecil Williams or in his absence the
18 Vice Chairman or the Treasurer is hereby authorized to nego-
19 tiate and execute the contracts or amendments thereto for
20 the duration of the contract.
21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this contract shall begin on October 1,
22 1976 and end on September 30, 1977, but may be extended by
23 mutual agreement of both parties.
24 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on
25 the 8th day of October, 1976, at a meeting at which a quorum was
26 present with a vote of 834.0 for; 0 against; 0 not vot-
27 ing; and 2 absent; pursuant to authority vested in the Papago
28 Council by Section 2 (a) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws
29 of the Papago Tribe of Arizona, ratified by the Tribe on December 12,
30 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937,
31 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution
32 is effective as of the date of its approval by the Superintendent of
the Papago Agency and is not subject to review by the Secretary of
the Interior.
