

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 71-76

1 WHEREAS, the U.S. Congress has made funding available through the Economic Develop-  
2 ment Administration (E.D.A.) for construction of public buildings and  
3 facilities and for the employment of the unemployed; and

4 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has a need for construction of a number of public faci-  
5 lities which are included in previous Tribal plans and priorities; and

6 WHEREAS, the three highest priority projects which are sufficiently advanced in  
7 planning to meet E.D.A. application requirements are: The Papago Health  
8 Facility; the Sells Early Childhood Education Center and the Construction  
9 and Renovation of Papago Farms Agricultural Facilities; and

10 WHEREAS, the Papago Reservation has an exceptionally high level of unemployment.

11 NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Council does designate the three  
12 above projects as the priorities for funding under this legislation and  
13 does authorize the preparation and submission of proposals to E.D.A. for  
14 these projects;

15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Council does authorize the Chairman of the Papago  
16 Tribe, or in his absence the Vice-Chairman, to negotiate and execute the  
17 grant and any amendments for the duration of the grant period.

18 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 19th day  
19 of November, 1976, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of  
20 801.0 FOR: 0 AGAINST; 33.0 NOT VOTING and 3 ABSENT; pursuant to authority  
21 vested in the Papago Council by Section 2(a), (e) and (f), Article V of the Con-  
22 stitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified by the Tribe on  
23 December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6,  
24 1937 (48 Stat. 984) pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said  
25 Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of Interior and is effective  
26 as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.

23 FOR; 0 AGAINST; 33.0 NOT VOTING and 3 ABSENT; pursuant to authority vested in  
24 the Papago Council by Section 2(a), (e) and (f), Article V of the Constitution  
25 and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified by the Tribe on December 12,  
1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937 (48 Stat.  
984) pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is not  
subject to review by the Secretary of Interior and is effective as of the date of  
its enactment by the Papago Council.




