	WHEREAS,	at congressional oversight hearings held on October 23rd		
9		and 24th, 1975 before the Committee on Interior and Insular		
10		Affairs of the United States Senate, 94th Congress, 1st Ses-		
11		sion, the Five Central Arizona Tribes submitted testimony		
12		concerning the irrigation history and water resources and		
13		rights of their respective reservations; and		
14	WHEREAS,	due to the conflicting interests served by the various		
15		Bureaus of the Department of Interior, the Secretary of		
16		Interior has, as a trustee of Tribal water rights and re-		
17		sources, failed to recognize and protect the water rights		
18		and resources legally reserved to the Five Central Arizona		
19		Tribes under the Winters and Cappaert Doctrines and in		
20	*	accordance with the rule laid down in Arizona v. California;

22	WHEREAS,	Kent Frizzell, Acting Secretary of Interior, did on October		
23		12, 1976, sign the "Allocation of Project Water for Indian		
24		Irrigation Use", which was published in the Federal Register		
25		(41 FR 45883) on October 18, 1976; and		
26	WHEREAS,	in making said allocation the Secretary of Interior, as		
27		trustee, failed to recognize and to protect the water enti-		
28		tlements of the Papago people and the water rights and		
29		resources of the Papago Reservation; failed as trustee to		
30		resolve the conflicting interests served by the various		
31		Bureaus of his Department in favor of the Indian; failed to		
32		comply with the Administrative Procedures Act necessary be-		

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l		fore setting priorities for use of CAP water; and failed to					
2		complete an environmental impact statement prior to making					
3		the allocation of CAP water to the Five Central Arizona					
4		Tribes; and					
5	WHEREAS,	it is essential that the rights of the Papago people and of					
6		the Papago Reservation be protected from the effect of the					
7		Secretary's allocation, and that independent legal counsel					
8		and expert assistance be obtained to assist the Papago Tribe.					
9	NOW, THEI	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council, that the Com-					
10		missioner of Indian Affairs is hereby requested to take such					
11		action as may be necessary and to provide the Papago Tribe,					
12		directly or by contracts, with independent legal counsel and					
13		expert assistance, in order to fully advise the Tribe of its					
14		rights and to institute such action(s) as may be required					
15	н. 	to protect the rights of the Papago Tribe, the Papago Reser-					
16		vation, and its members.					
17	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Papago Council feels that this matter						
18		falls within the function of the Bureau of Indian Affairs'					
19		trust protection and responsibility.					
	The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 19th day of November, 1976, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 834.0 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 3 ab-						
	sent; pursuant to the authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (a), (b) and (c) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12						
23	1936, and	d approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6,					
24	1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the
