

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 11-78

1 WHEREAS, the President of the United States has proclaimed Indian Self-Determina-
2 tion as a goal of the government and has made money available through
3 the Indian Health Service for grants to Tribal-Governments in achieving
4 self-determination in health areas; and

5 WHEREAS, such grant funds are now available to Papago for use in health planning
6 evaluations, training, federal matching, and to improve and develop
7 the Tribal health administrative capability, and

8 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribal Council in May 1977 did enact Resolution #36-77 for
9 preliminary design, and Resolution #83-77 for final working documents
10 in the development of final phase for construction of Tribal Health
11 Complex.

12 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Tribal Council does authorize and
13 request a P.L. 93-638 implementation grant from the Indian Health
14 Service of the Department of Health, Educaiton, and Welfare.

15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that it does authorize the use of said grant funds for
16 administrative equipment to furnish the above referenced facilities
17 for the following Tribal Health programs:

18 Community Health Representatives

19 Executive Health Staff

20 Alcoholism

21 Mental Health

22 Nutrition

23 Disease Control

24 Elderly

25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Mr. Cecil Williams, Chairman; or in his absence,
26 Mr. Max H. Norris, Vice Chairman; or Mr. Vincent Crawford, Treasurer;
27 are hereby authorized to negotiate and execute the necessary grant
28 documents and any supplements, amendments or revisions thereto and to
29 administer such grant for the duration of the grant.

30 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 23rd
31 day of March, 1978, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
32 for; against; not voting and 5 absent; pursuant to authority

1 vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (d) of Article V of the Constitution
2 and by-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona, ratified by the Tribe on December
3 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of Interior on January 6, 1937 pursuant
4 to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984) said Resolution, is
5 not subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of
6 the date of its enactment by the Papago Council
