

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

Res. No. 13-78

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe of Arizona is presently having facilities constructed
2 for the Tribal Health Program with funds obtained from the Local Public
3 Works Capital Development and Investment Program (LPW) (Title I, P.L.
4 94-639) Round II. and;


5 WHEREAS, such facilities will consist of roadways and parking. The facilities
6 will have (2) two access roads to the Arizona State Highway 86 which
7 will require paving from highway to property line, also the installation
8 of cattle guards. (3) three each, to be installed. and;

9 WHEREAS, the above mentioned cattle guards are to be obtained through the LPW
10 funds.

11 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that the new roadways and
12 parking of the Tribal Health facilities be added to the present Bureau
13 of Indian Affairs (BIA) road systems for the paving of entrance off of
14 Arizona State Highway 86 to property line, also for the installation of
15 cattle guards (3) three each (2) each on 86 and (1) one between the
16 Tribal Health facilities and Indian Health Service (IHS).

17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the foregoing resolution was duly enacted by the Papago
18 Council on the 7th day of April, 1978, at a meeting at which a quorum
19 was present with a vote of 702 for; 147.5 against; 215.5 not voting;
20 and 2 absent pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council by Sec-
21 tion 2 (a) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago
22 Tribe of Arizona, ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved
23 by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to section
24 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not
25 subject to review by the Secretary of Interior and is effective as of
26 the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.

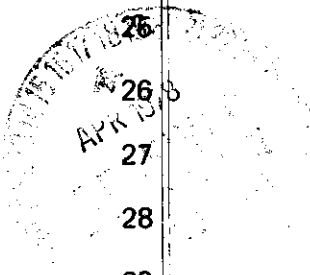
