

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. No. 15-78

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has a major mine under development on the reservation
2 leased to Hecla Mining Company and El Paso Natural Gas Company known as
3 the Lakeshore Mine, from which the Tribe received royalty income; and

4 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe and certain allottees have another major mine in pro-
5 duction on the San Xavier portion of the Reservation leased to ASARCO,
6 from which the Tribe and allottees receive royalty income; and

7 WHEREAS, the royalty payments due to the Tribe and allottees is computed by for-
8 mulas based on the net smelter return to the mining companies for
9 minerals sold; and

10 WHEREAS, the net smelter return is determined by various assays, tests and pro-
11 cedures performed by the mining companies and the smelters or buyers
12 to which the minerals are sold; and

13 WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs has offered to fund an inspector to monitor
14 these assays, tests and procedures performed at the mines and the smel-
15 ters for the Tribe.

16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Council requests the Bureau of
17 Indian Affairs to fund an inspector to monitor the assays, tests and
18 procedures performed at the Lakeshore mine, the San Xavier mine, the
19 smelters or other buyers to which minerals are sold, and any future
20 mines which the Tribe may choose to develop; the duties of such inspec-
21 tor shall include; but not be limited to, monitoring ore co-mingling
22 procedures, sampling, assaying, flotation tests, metalurgical balances
23 and processes, and any other procedures affecting royalty calculations.

24 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 11th day
25 of April, 1978, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 600.5
26 for; 54 against; 410.5 not voting; 1 absent, pursuant to the authority vested
27 in the Council by Section 2 (d) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of
28 the Papago Tribe as amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936,
29 and approved by the Secretary of the interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to
30 Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not
31 subject to review by the Secretary of Interior and is effective as of the date
32 of its enactment by the Papago Council


