

RESOLUTION OF PAPAGO COUNCIL

RES. NO. 16-78

WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe has reviewed its long range planning program and needs; and

WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe did receive in fiscal year 1978 a special appropriation for the purpose of developing Papago Farms in order to appropriate the waters in an aquifer along the Mexican border and from which Mexican farms were pumping at increasing rates; and

WHEREAS, said appropriation for Papago Farms was a partial appropriation and anticipated subsequent appropriations to complete the project; and

WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe is in desperate need for new or additional jail facilities to accommodate illegal border traffic across the Mexican border, and for funds to increase the pay scale and training of its police force in order to meet a new crisis in its administration of Law and Order brought on by the Oliphant case; and


WHEREAS, the Papago Council has segregated both Papago Farms and Law and Order for emergency appropriation requests, and has prioritized other special appropriation requests in accordance with the attached schedule.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby designate the second phase of the development of Papago Farms; the construction of a new jail facility and justice building at Sells, Arizona; and the upgrading of its law and Order to meet the new crisis brought on by the Oliphant case, as emergency priorities of the Papago Tribe.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Papago Council does hereby designate the other projects listed in the attached schedule, under "Special Appropriation Priorities", as projects requiring immediate funding and implementation, and does hereby authorize and direct the Chairman of the Papago Council and his staff to prepare and submit appropriation requests for fiscal year 1979 to Congress.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 11th day of April, 1978, at a meeting at which a quorum was present, by a vote of 1011 for, 54 against; 54 not voting; and 1 absent, pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (d) of Article 3 of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 934). This Resolution is not subject to review by the Secretary of Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
