


RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

Res. No. 19-78

1 WHEREAS, the Arizona Department of Economic Security (ADES) in a  
 2 letter dated, April 11, 1978 has informed the Papago Tribe  
 3 that ADES will act as a funding conduit for the Emergency  
 4 Energy Assistance (EEAP) in the amount of \$2,100; and  
 5 WHEREAS, the EEAP is designed to assist and or relieve the elderly  
 6 and the poor of the high cost of heating for the winter  
 7 months past; and  
 8 WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe is interested in receiving the grant  
 9 funds allotted for Papago; and  
 10 WHEREAS, ADES needs a tribal resolution for the Tribe to show its  
 11 willingness to participate in EEAP and any future energy/  
 12 weatherization programs that will be in the best interest  
 13 of the Papago Tribe.


14 NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Papago Tribal Council does  
 15 wish to participate in the ADES, EEAP and any future simi-  
 16 lar energy/weatherization programs that may be announced  
 17 from time to time.

18 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on  
 19 the 26th day of April, 1978, at a meeting at which a quorum was  
 20 present with a vote of 799 for; 495 against; 216.5 not voting;  
 21 and 1 absent; pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council by  
 22 Section 2 (a) and (d) and Section 3 (h) of Article V of the Consti-  
 23 tution of the Papago Tribe of Arizona, ratified by the Tribe on  
 24 December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior  
 25 on January 6, 1937 (48 Stat. 984), pursuant to Section 16 of the  
 26 Act of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date  
 27 of its approval by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency and is  
 28 subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior.
