

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL

Res. No. 22-78

1 WHEREAS, the Gu Achi District Elderly Program proposes to occupy Building No. 417
2 that is a BIA building, and

3 WHEREAS, it is possible via this Resolution for that building to be transferred
4 by BIA to the tribe for use by the Gu Achi District Elderly Program,
5 and

6 WHEREAS, said Building No. 417 is located within the compound known as the old
7 Santa Rosa School, with four stall garage, is a wood frame building
8 with stucco exterior, and

9 WHEREAS, said building is in structually sound condition, and

10 WHEREAS, the Gu Achi District desires to use the building for their Elderly
11 Program, and

12 WHEREAS, said building and improvements are no longer used by the BIA, and
13 should be the property of the Gu Achi District.

14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that the following described
15 building and improvements located in the compound in Santa Rosa Village,
16 Gu Achi District, is hereby transferred, assigned, and set over to the
17 Gu Achi District:

18 Building No. 417, Four stall garage,
19 wood frame stucco exterior

20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chairman and Secretary of the Gu Achi District
21 Council are hereby authorized, on behalf of the Papago Tribe, to receive
22 and receipt for any such facilities transferred or assigned to the
23 District by the Bureau of Indian Affairs pursuant to the request contained
24 in this Resolution.

25 The foregoing resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on 5th., day
26 of May, 1978, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
27 1011 for; 54.0 against; 54.0 not voting, 0 not voting, and
28 3 absent; pursuant to authority vested in the Papago Council by Section
29 2 (a) of Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe of
30 Arizona ratified by the Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary
of Interior on January 6, 1937 (48 Stat. 984) pursuant to Section 16 of the Act
of June 18, 1934. Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approved
by the Superintendent of the Papago Agency, and is not subject to review by the
Secretary of the Interior.
