9	WHEREAS,	the Papago Tribe is now able to itself administer and provide such ser-						
10		vices; and						
11	WHEREAS,	the Bureau of Indian Affairs has funds appropriated from the Department	•					
12		of Transportation to provide grants to Tribes for such services during						
13		Fiscal Year 1978.						
14	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it does hereby re-							
15		quest a grant/contract with the Bureau of Indian Affairs to provide a						
16		general Highway Safety Program in accordance with the attached Tribal						
17		staffing and funding requests submitted in accordance with the Depart-						
18		ment of Transportation Annual Work Program application requirements.						
19	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Mr. Cecil Williams, Chairman, or in his absence,							
20		the Vice Chairman or Treasurer, hereby be authorized to negotiate and						
21		execute the grant/contract or amendments thereto for the duration of						
22		the contract.						
23	BE IT FU	RTHER RESOLVED that this grant/contract shall begin on July 1, 1977 and						
24		end September 30, 1978 and may be extended by mutual agreement of both						
25		parties.

27	of <u>May</u> 1978, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of <u>1065.0 for; 0</u> against; 0 not voting; and 1 absent, pursuant to auth-

29	1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Sa
