RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL (Authorizing U. S. Geological Survey) (to drill monitoring wells in Chukut) (Kuk District )

1	WHEREAS, recent agricultural developments and planned future
2	agricultural developments have given rise to several
3	questions in regard to the water resources of the
4	Papago Farms area in the Chukut Kuk District of the
5	Papago Indian Reservation; and
6	WHEREAS, the U. S. Congress has appropriated funds for a 4
7	year study to prepare a basic data report and prepare
8	a hydrologic atlas that will
9	(1) Depict the reconnaissance geology and location
10	of wells and springs;
11	(2) Delineate the main water-bearing units;
12	(3) Show the regional patterns of groundwater move-
13	ment and water quality and delineate areas where
14	domestic and irrigation water can be developed;
15	(4) Show historic changes in water levels resulting
16	from groundwater development; and
17	(5) Revise and update the "Summary of Groundwater
18	on the Papago Indian Reservation (HA-55)" which
19	shows the productibility of Aquifers and the
20	general chemical quality of water on the
21	Reservation, and
22	WHEREAS, the U. S. Geological Survey has been given the respon-
23	sibility in achieving the above goals and has request
24	ed permission to drill six monitoring wells in variou
25	locations in the Chukut Kuk District; and
26	WHEREAS, the Chukut Kuk District Council did on July 8, 1978,
27	by Resolution give its permission to drilling of such
28	monitoring wells.
29	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that the
30	permission is hereby granted to the U. S. Geological
31	Survey to drill six monitoring wells in the Chukut
32	Kuk District, the exact locations of which shall be

agreed upon in advance by the Chairman of the Chukut Kuk District Council, provided that the U. S. Geological Survey will supply the Paapgo Tribe with all basic data and the hydrologic atlas upon completion of the study.

The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the \_\_4 \_\_day of August, 1978, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of 927.5 for; \_\_0 \_\_against; \_\_137.5 \_\_not voting; and \_\_0 absent, pursuant to the authority vested in the Council by Section 2 (a) of Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe as amanded, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the Secreatry of Interior and is effective as of the date of its enactment by the Papago Council.
