. RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL

RES. NO. 48-78

1	WHEREAS, the Administration for Native Americans (ANA), formely the Uffice of
2	Native American Program (ONAP) in their letter dated June 7, 1978,
3	has informed the Papago Tribe that it does intend to fund the Papago
4	Tribe for \$357,000; and
5	WHEREAS, the Papago Tribe does have a local ANA funded program, Community Action
6	Program (CAP); and
7	WHEREAS, the CAP does have as its board, one (1) representative from each of
8	the eleven (11) districts, which is delegated and has the authority
9	to review and approve the CAP plans and budget; and
10	WHEREAS, the CAP Board has reviewed and have planned on the use of the proposed
11	\$357,000 grant and feel that it will be to the best interest of the
12	Papago people that it does apply for the funds.
13	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Papago Tribal Council does recognize
14	the authority of the CAP Board to plan, approve and apply for the
15	\$357,000 funds intended for the Papago Tribe.
16	The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 4th day
17	of August, 1978, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote of
18	948.5 for; 99 against 17.5 not voting; and 0 absent, pursuant to authority
19	vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and (d) and Section 3 (h) of
20	Article V of the Constitution and Bylaws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona, rafitied
21	by the Tribe on December 12, 1936 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior
22	on January 6, 1937 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.
23	984). Said Resolution is effective as of the date of its approval by the Super-
24	intendent of the Papago Agency and is subject to review by the Secretary of the
25	Interior.
