

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO COUNCIL
Indian Child Welfare Act

RES. NO. 2-80

1 WHEREAS, there is a need to develop foster care standards for Papago children,
2 and others, that will reflect the values and child rearing practices
3 of the Papago People, and

4 WHEREAS, there exists a need to increase and develop Indian Child and Family
5 Service Programs designed with the objective of preventing the break-
6 up of Indian families and to insure that removal of a child take place
7 only as a last resort, and

8 WHEREAS, there is a need for additional personnel at the Papago Children's Court
9 to assist in child welfare matters, and

10 WHEREAS, Title II of the Indian Child Welfare Act of 1978, P.L. 95-608 authorizes
11 the Secretary of the Interior to make grants available to Indian Tribes
12 for family services programs and for establishing child welfare
13 codes, and

14 WHEREAS, the United States Department of the Interior, Bureau of Indian Affairs
15 has announced that Indian Tribes and Indian organizations may submit
16 grant applications under Title II of the Indian Child Welfare Act of
17 1978 (P.L. 95-608), and

18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the Papago Tribal Council is concerned
19 for the social and moral welfare of it's members, and does hereby
20 request the Bureau of Indian Affairs to consider and to fund the
21 above stated needs, and

22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, Mr. Max H. Norris, Chairman, or in his absence
23 Mr. Enos J. Francisco, Jr., Vice-Chairman, are hereby authorized to
24 delegate, negotiate and sign whatever documents and required for this
25 application.

26 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 11th
27 day of January, 1980, at a meeting at which a quorum was present, with a vote
28 of 965 for; 0 against; 0 not voting; and 0 absent,
29 pursuant to the authority vested in the Council by Section II, (a) and (h) of
30 Article V of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Papago Tribe as amended,
31 ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by the Secretary
32 of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June
18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to review by the
Secretary of Interior and is effective as of the date of it's enactment by the
Papago Council.
