

RESOLUTION OF THE PAPAGO TRIBAL COUNCIL  
(Supporting NCAI Recommendations - ANA)

RES. NO. 100-80

1 WHEREAS, the Papago Community Action Program has reported certain recommenda-  
2 tions to the Papago Council which were supported by the Human Resource  
3 Committee of the National Congress of American Indians concerning  
4 programs administered by the Administration for Native Americans  
5 ("ANA") under Title VIII of the Community Services Act, and the  
6 Papago Council does fully support such recommendations.

7 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Papago Council that it hereby recommends  
8 that:

- 9 1. Since the ANA has been unable to meet its diverse responsibilities  
10 to Indian tribal governments, urban Indian Centers and other  
11 Native American groups at the \$32 to \$33.8 million funding level  
12 that has prevailed over the last seven fiscal years, the  
13 Administration must seek a substantial increase in this funding  
14 level. The Appropriations Committees of both the House and Senate  
15 are urged to hold special hearings on the ANA budget, taking  
16 testimony from Indian governments and organizations. Acting on  
17 the basis of the need shown in these hearings, the Congress should  
18 approve a funding increase.
- 19 2. The Papago Council voices serious concerns about the new ANA policy  
20 initiative called Social and Economic Development Strategies  
21 (SEDS). Indian Tribes and other affected groups must be consulted  
22 in the development of such a policy initiative. ANA should not  
23 implement SEDS by defunding existing grantees or reducing the  
24 funding levels for existing programs. ANA should not impose time  
25 limits on the continuation of its ongoing support for Indian  
26 Tribes and off-reservation groups, and ANA grants should continue  
27 in the light of the principle of self-determination rather than  
28 imposing federal agency ideas of program priorities on Tribes or  
29 other grantees. ANA should publish information on the distribution  
30 of all ANA funds by grantee and program type in order to indicate  
31 the source of the funds it is allocating to the SEDS approach.
- 32 3. Since the authorization for ANA programs, Title VIII of the  
Community Services Act, expires at the end of Fiscal Year 1981,  
the Administration and the Congress should develop a plan to  
consult with Indian Tribes and organizations on the renewal of  
this Act and other administrative and policy issues.
4. Better communications be developed by ANA with the Indian tribal  
governments, certain Indian centers and other Native American  
groups.

1 The foregoing Resolution was duly enacted by the Papago Council on the 7th  
2 day of October, 1980, at a meeting at which a quorum was present with a vote  
3 of 843.5 for; 0 against; 71. not voting; and 2 absent, pursuant  
4 to the authority vested in the Papago Council by Section 2 (a) and (d) of  
5 Article V of the Constitution and By-laws of the Papago Tribe of Arizona as  
6 amended, ratified by the Papago Tribe on December 12, 1936, and approved by  
7 the Secretary of the Interior on January 6, 1937, pursuant to Section 16 of  
8 the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984). Said Resolution is not subject to  
9 review by the Secretary of the Interior and is effective as of the date of its  
10 enactment by the Papago Council.
